EARL BAILLY INDIVIDUAL BURSARY FUND

The Lunenburg Foundation for the Arts has established the Earl Bailly Bursary Fund to be used by individuals for education in the arts. Applicants eligible to apply for funding will be in one of two categories, both limited to people having a confirmed disability that presents challenges in pursuing their chosen art form. Art forms include music, visual art, dance, theatre, writing and fine craft.

AWARD

Two categories:

High School Student Bursary

\$500 to a Nova Scotia High School student, pursuing artistic endeavours.

Eligible activities:

- Workshop led by a relevant professional
- Arts camp program in summer or school breaks led by a relevant professional
- Private study with a relevant professional
- Contribution towards first year tuition at a post-secondary institute where study will include relevant art

Emerging or Established Artist

\$500 to an emerging or established artist residing in Nova Scotia, wanting to participate in an educational activity.

Eligible activities:

- Workshop, master class or course led by a relevant professional
- Private study with a relevant professional
- Assistance for costs associated with formal post graduate studies

Ineligible expenses:

- Costs while pursuing a self-directed project

One award will be made in each category annually.

Projects should be completed by December 31st in the year it was granted unless otherwise approved by the Foundation. Funds cannot be used for any other purpose than that specified in the application. If the funds are not used for the intended project they must be returned to the Foundation.

APPLICATION

High School Student Bursary: Applicant must complete a statement of interest explaining the intended use of the funds, in 500 words or less. The statements should answer the following questions: name of the project/event/course/, what organization or individual is offering it, name of the instructor, the dates of the program, location of the program, and a description of the content of the program.

Emerging or Established Artist: Applicant to complete a statement of interest explaining the intended use of the funds, in 500 words or less. The statements would answer the following questions: name of the project/event/course/, what organization or individual is offering it, who is the instructor, the dates of the program, location of the program, and a description of the content of the program.

The applicant must also include:

- A cv/résumé of their own education, qualifications, activities, etc
- 2 letters of recommendation to be submitted with the application
- A completed budget form.
- If the bursary is for private study, a cv/résumé, website address and any other relevant information that establish the instructor's qualifications

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION

Completed applications must be received by May 15th

ADJUDICATION

A panel appointed by the Lunenburg Foundation for the Arts will assess applications. Award will be determined based on:

- Applicant's experience to date
- Statement of interest
- Budget
- Letters of recommendation.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF BURSARY AWARDS

Awards will be announced no later than June 15th

A press release will be sent out naming the recipients

FOLLOW UP REPORT

Proof of appropriate use of funds will be required and a description of how the project has impacted the applicant's artistic practice. The actual budget figures added to application budget form must be submitted within 2 months of completion of the project or course of study.
